## 46bis.-SWEDEN WINS IN PARIS!

At the Gourmand World Cookbook Awards 2008, Sweden is the fifth country in the world in the number of medals, behind the US, the UK, France and Spain.

The glamorous event took place on July 2, 2009 at La Comédie Française, the historical theatre of Molière, in Paris. Past events were in London (2008), Beijing (2007), Kuala Lumpur (2006), Örebro (2005). The Awards might come back to Scandinavia very soon!

## **Fish and Seafood**

Sweden, and Scandinavia year after year do very well in the "Fish and Seafood" category. This year, Sweden won third place for "Best Fish Book in the World"

## **Innovative Food Book**

Sweden now has very innovative publishers. It won third place for "Best Innovative Food Book" MATeMATik

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## **Food Professionals Book**

The current quality of Sweden food and wine publishing can also be credited to the food training and professionals of the sector. Sweden takes third place for "Best Food Professionals Book in the World"

## Wine Books

Wine book writers are doing well in Sweden. There is a demand from new and established wine consumers to read about wine. Publishers invest in new wine books. Swedish wine writers have years of experience and travel all around the world. Their quality is recognized among the best, and they win more medals than ever this year at the Gourmand Awards.
